As you are aware our core provider, FiServ, has opted back to use the EVC once again as an added layer of security for our online banking products. Phishing and Online Fraud Undermine Customer Confidence: More people have access to the Internet in more ways and they spend more time online than ever before. However, reluctance to transact online remains. Phishing scams and online fraud have created doubt and concern among online shoppers.

- 83% of consumers want more assurance that their information is secure
- 86% of online shoppers feel more confident about entering personal information on sites using security indicators
- Fear of identity theft resulted in online retailers missing out on \$21 billion in sales in 2008

For businesses with a high profile brand, using Extended Validation (EV) SSL Certificates has proven to be an effective defense against phishing scams. An (EV) SSL Certificate is designed to give customers the confidence that they are interacting with the intended Web site and that their information is secure.

Today, when shoppers visit a Web site secured with an (EV) SSL Certificate, mainstream browsers, such as Microsoft Internet Explorer 7 and above, FireFox and others will show the presence of an (EV) SSL Certificate distinctively with a Green Address Bar and display the name of the organization listed in the certificate as well as the certificate's security vendor. The browser and the security vendor control the display, making it difficult for phishers and counterfeiters to hijack your brand and your customers.


